

SB-1046 Three steps to regain your license and avoid hard suspension after a DUI

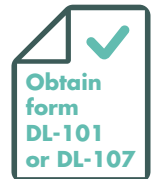
Per California DMV Administrative Authority, your CA Driver's license will be suspended 30 days following a first time DUI arrest, 90 days for a second arrest, 120 days for 3 or more arrests.

Effective 1/1/2019, SB-1046 allows you to avoid the mandatory administrative hard suspension of your license. To avoid this mandatory hard suspension of your license and maintain complete driving privileges, you must complete, as soon as possible and prior to your court hearing, the following three steps:

1 INSTALL CA STATE LICENSED IGNITION INTERLOCK DEVICE (IID)



2 ENROLL AND COMPLY WITH STATE CERTIFIED DRINKING AND DRIVING PROGRAM (DDP)



3 GET AND MAINTAIN AN SR-22 INSURANCE CERTIFICATE



EARN DAY FOR DAY CREDIT FOR YOUR INTERLOCK AND DDP PROGRAM BEFORE GOING TO COURT



Following a DUI arrest, a CA Licensed Driver will receive a minimum of 30-day (first time offender longer for multiple offenses) administrative hard suspension of his/her license. In an attempt to, "Go Safely California," SB-1046 will allow drivers arrested for a DUI, who comply with the three steps above, to avoid the mandatory administrative 30-day hard suspension (longer with prior DUI offenses) of their license and maintain complete driving privileges.

You **MUST** complete the required three steps as soon as possible after your arrest. Steps can be completed prior to a court hearing if an individual chooses to avoid the minimum 30-day (longer with priors) administrative hard suspension. Day for Day credit will be given at the time of sentencing to individuals who comply prior to court.
